

WHAT IS TITLE I?

Title I, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) provides financial assistance to state and school districts to meet the needs of educationally at-risk students. The goal of Title I is to provide supplemental instructional services and activities which support students identified at risk of failing the state's challenging performance standards in reading.

TITLE I GOALS

- Support all student's academic success
- Set goals for improving skills of students in need of services
- Measure student progress to determine success of students and programs being used
- Develop strategies and practice for individual students to support the regular education program



What Does Instruction Look Like?

Title I instructional programs all include an opportunity for additional direct reading instruction. Instruction includes:

- Small group (2-6 students)
- One teacher
- Skill practice
- Reading practice
- Aligns with classroom instruction

What can I do?

You, as the parent, influence school success more than any program or teacher. When you become an active participant in the Title I program, you will:

- Serve as a role model, showing that you support your child's education.
- Assure that you are aware of your child's educational progress, showing how important your child's progress is to you.
- Teach your student that your input at school is appreciated and that you support the efforts of your child and teacher.

What Does Research Say?

Research shows that how well students do in school depends a great deal on how much parents get involved in the child's education.
